WATERCOLOR FLOWER CANISTER



MATERIALS

CCX069 XL Canister
Studio Stuff 4" Circle Sticker
Medium Brush
Liner Brush
Water Based Marker
Straight Pin

COLORS

CMM 72 - Sahara
CMM 73 - Safari
CMM 82 - Olive You
CMM 18 - Pumpkin Pie
CMM 92 - Ghostly Grape
CMM 42 - Cranberry Sauce
CMM 66 - Pink Berry

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Apply your 4" circle sticker to the side of your canister. It will wrinkle slightly as you seal it on, use your fingernail to press the wrinkles as flat as you can.
2. Pour out a big puddle of Sahara and a big puddle of Safari. Add water to each color (about 50% water to 50% paint) and mix them up.
3. Sweep on the background using your fan brush making x shaped movements alternating between the two colors. Allowing them to overlap. Paint right on top of the sticker and all over the outside of the canister and the top of the lid. Repeat for a second coat.
4. Water down some Olive You and paint the knob on the lid with two coats of paint.
5. Once the background is dry, use your straight pin to remove the sticker. Poke inside the sticker and lift up to remove.
6. Use your water based marker to draw a circle about an inch around where the sticker was.
7. Water down the rest of your colors with about 50/50 paint and water.
8. Apply flowers around the circle using different colors and making them different shapes and sizes. For the center of the flowers use the stick end of the brush to apply dots of color.
9. Fill in the remaining space with leaves and stems using Olive You.
10. Use your liner brush to apply broken outlines around the edge of where the sticker was located.
11. Finally, use your marker to sketch out your writing before painting it on with Olive You.

TIPS

- You only need to do one coat on these for the water color effect.
- Don't be too stressed about the flower shapes, we are going for organic.
- The harder you push down on the liner brush, the thicker the line will be.
